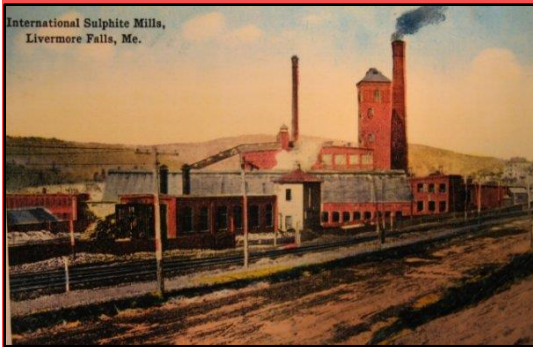


## Our Mission:

To create an exciting interactive museum where visitors can experience life in a paper-making community, as well as to encourage tourism, increase economic activity and showcase the distinctive heritage of the area.

How we got started: In 2002 a grassroots project emerged in the western Maine mountains. Led by Darryl Brown, and two women pioneers, Sherry Judd and Susan Gagnon, community members dedicated to preserving the history of the paper industry came together to establish Maine's Paper & Heritage Museum. Through their fundraising efforts and generous donations, they have captured the cultural heritage of paper making along the Androscoggin River and the local history of Livermore Falls.

## Come and Explore

Maine's Paper and Heritage Museum houses an extensive collection of artifacts and interactive displays from the paper making industry such as:

- Logging equipment such as Chain Saws, Buck Saw, and much more
- Time keeping office equipment: time clock, office phone, check writer
- Lab equipment to test paper quality
- Scale model showing the inner workings of a paper mill and the paper making process
- Photos and memories from local paper mills
- Local history of the Livermore Falls and Jay Communities
- Working vintage model trains!



## You are invited to...

Enjoy a journey back in time. Follow the paper making industry through two centuries and see where it is today. Learn who created some of the first post cards in America or how important the railroad was to the growth of the paper industry. Come and see where the world's largest manufacturer of wallpaper was located and much more!

**History of the building:** The home was built in 1906 by Judson Record, one of the first industrialists of the area. In 1917, then owner William Murray signed the property over to International Paper. It became the residence for managers of International Paper's nearby paper mill. In 1990, it was converted to an office for the company's regional forest resources team. In 2007, International Paper donated the building to Maine's Paper & Heritage Museum. The house on Church Street in Livermore Falls is now home to the museum's exhibits and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.
